INTRODUCTION TO THE BUTANE TORCH - \$25

BALLED END HEADPINS

Instructor: Christina Level: Any Prerequisite: None

If you make jewelry with wire, it's likely you use plenty of headpins. This class is designed for those who want to reduce their costs on findings and add another personal element to their work. The torch used in class is unimimidating and easy to work with. Students will learn the most basic metalsmithing technique for creating balled headpins with fine silver, sterling silver and copper. This class covers safe usage of a butane torch, basic equipment and the least toxic chemicals needed (some are simple household products) along with pertinent chemical safety considerations. Please do not wear very loose clothing or open toed shoes to class.

STAMPED PENDANTS & CHARMS - \$45

Using pre-cut metal blanks, students will learn how to create dramatic textures on metal with a super easy and fun embossing technique. The textured pieces will be pierced for ear wires and colored with basic metal patinas. In this faced paced class you will make as many earrings as time allows. So, so perfect for holiday gift giving!

RIVETING I - \$35

STACKED AND RIVETED EARRINGS

Instructor: Christina Level: Beginner

Prerequisite: Wire I or Equivalent

Riveting is a great option for attaching metals without solder or glue.

In this class you'll learn how to layer, dap and rivet pre-cut metal shapes with a standard TACK rivet of any size. You will also learn how to create a versatile connector finding with heavy gauge wire and techniques and tools for cutting and piercing repurposed tin. You will complete a quick and easy pair of earrings in class.

MIXED METALS RIVETED PENDANTS - \$40

Instructor: Christina Level: Intermediate

Prerequisite: Riveting I

This cold connection is the perfect alternative to attaching metals without solder or glue. In this class you will learn several different techniques for riveting metal, using wire, tacks, and tubing and why you might use one method over another. You can choose from a wide variety of metal components in class (or bring anything from home you'd like to work with) to create a small sculptural work of wearable art. This is also versatile metal smithing skill to add to your repertoire

EASY METAL ETCHING - \$45

Prerequisite: Prior work with metals helpful, but not mandatory

A low-tech solution will be used to etch the design onto the surface of the metal to create a three-dimensional image. Incorporate the pieces you create in class into pendants and earrings. This process is very simple and easy to replicate at home. Feel free to bring rubber stamps you'd like to work with. Wear play clothes.

Students will learn to transfer a drawing or stamped letter image onto a copper blank and create an etched surface on both sides. You will create 3 pieces in this class. This is a very simple and easy process to replicate at home. Feel free to bring rubber stamps.

CUT AWAY METAL CUFF - \$40

Instructor: Christina Level: Advanced

*Prerequisite: Intro to the Butane Torch or equivalent
(must be comfortable using a butane torch)*

Forge a heavy metal cuff bracelet with unique "cut out" design elements. In this advanced metals class students will learn to draw, cut, file, texture and form a cuff bracelet from sheet metal. A variety of methods for creating the "cut out" design will be applied and finished with basic metal patinas. This modern/tribal piece lends itself well to many variations.

COILED BANGLE BRACELETS- \$40

Bangles are a very popular and versatile style of bracelet. They can be worn alone or in multiples and compliment any wardrobe. This class offers some new challenges for your intermediate wire working skills. In class, students will form a bangle with heavy gauge wire and learn a variety of hand and machine coiling techniques for embellishment and finally, create a swan clasp closure. This project is a great way to showcase a special bead or beads. It can also be made without beads. Feel free to bring any special beads from home that have holes large enough to accommodate 16gauge wire

BEADWORLD MAKES A DIFFERENCE!

WHY MOST OF BEADWORLD'S FINDINGS ARE AMERICAN MADE

In the past, we found that imported plated findings were problematic for several reasons. First, they were NOT nickel-free. There is a lot of questionable, very poor quality metal referred to as “mystery metal.” Studies show most people develop an allergy to metals overtime—so it is best not to get exposed in the first place. Second, the plating tends to flake off. Colors are not consistent, particularly if you seek consistency in your hardware (e.g. matching jump rings, clasps, headpins, etc.). Finally, we want to support American manufacturers.

Currently, there are no US distributor with consistent finishes over all the different findings. As a result, we do our own plating. We do this for quality control and to assure competitive prices. Our manufacturers use clean metals to make our findings which we send to our platers. We know our findings are nickel and lead free. Going direct means we can offer a better product at a competitive price. It's a lot more work but so worth it.

BEAD DONATIONS

Beadworld is involved in several nonprofit programs, local schools, and international communities for educational and fund raising projects. We donate supplies and instruction. We welcome your donations.

If you have beads or supplies you don't want – please consider donating to Beadworld. We accept beads and supplies of all kinds. We keep a separate supply for nonprofits and locals schools to help.

CLASSES

Beadworld classes are designed to educate people about new projects and products. We keep the class prices very reasonable and include the supplies. We know that people like to explore new projects without a full commitment...to see if the work is a good fit for them. Our classes are designed to be small and engaging; including written instructions. On class days, students receive 10% off of anything in the store. Apart from classes, Beadworld offers a “community table” and talented staff to assist customers with their projects.

Beadworld can arrange private classes (examples of private classes have included: riveting, wire wrapping, resin, crochet beading). We also arrange parties of all kinds. Prior parties have included: wedding and bridesmaid gift get togethers, office parties, birthday and Xmas parties, etc.
